

**MINUTES OF THE MONTHLY CDC MEETING HELD WITH THE DEPARTMENTS  
UNDER NCHAC, HAFLONG, DIMA HASAO**

DATE – 20<sup>th</sup> Dec ' 2023

TIME – 1:00 PM

VENUE : Officers' Conference Hall, NCHAC, Haflong

The meeting was chaired by Sri T.T. Daulagupu, ACS, Principal Secretary, NCHAC. He initiated the discussion by informing the House that as informed earlier the team from National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disability – NIEPID had visited the district of Dima Hasao for screening and identification of Persons with Intellectual Disability. The team had conducted public awareness programme, screening and identification of PwIDs covering the five development Blocks of the district. Thereafter, a department-wise brief review of the departmental activities was conducted as follows:-

1	<b>MEDICAL &amp; PUBLIC HEALTH</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ The DPM i/c NHM and DME, NHM made a presentation on the Health scenario in Dima Hasao district. The DPM also highlighted about the need for more human resource and medical equipments as well as better health infrastructure in the district.</li> <li>➤ A brief discussion on the status of all ongoing civil works especially the new PHC at Thajjuwari was held. It was learnt that staff quarter was urgently required for Gunjung BPHC and Mahur BPHC. The old ones were all in dilapidated conditions and these need to be upgraded at the earliest.</li> <li>➤ The department also informed that Flogging machine was provided for prevention of Dengue etc. Mass awareness programmes including wide publicity were also carried out regarding Dengue – its control and prevention.</li> <li>➤ No maternal death as on date was reported with an Institutional Delivery of 68% recorded in the district.</li> <li>➤ The department also informed about the need for a Gynaecologist and better infrastructure at Gunjung BPHC and Maibang CHC for conducting Institutional Delivery.</li> <li>➤ With regard to less man power in the district it was learnt that most Doctors were reluctant to come and join and as such it was decided to identify local Doctors and other health staff, technician etc. posted elsewhere so that steps may be initiated for their posting in Dima Hasao.</li> <li>➤ It was also felt that Umrangso PHC be made a 2<sup>nd</sup> delivery point for Blood bank and other facilities.</li> <li>➤ It was reported that Haflong Civil Hospital has accommodated patients more than 100% of its capacity. Shortage of staff in the hospital was also discussed and these need to be filled up on topmost priority.</li> <li>➤ It was also suggested that cases involving Medico-legal reports be given utmost importance. It was felt that Doctors should be more sensitive towards cases involving crime against women and children.</li> <li>➤ The department was directed to expedite all civil works and that Haflong Civil Hospital be given preference. It was also felt all other Health Centres in the district could be upgraded gradually.</li> </ul>

4	SOIL CONSERVATION	<p>The D.O, Maibang informed that the department had taken up a new project under Gol namely, New Generation Watershed Development Project (WDC-PMKSY 2.0) at Upper Jatinga covering 10 villages with a Treatable Area of 4500 Ha and the project is named and numbered as “<i>Dima Hasao-WDC-1/2021-22/Upper Jatinga</i>”. The project was sanctioned during 2021-22 and the duration of the project is 5 years. He also informed that the project is functioning satisfactorily.</p>
5	P.W.D.	<p>The Principal Secretary conveyed his serious displeasure over the substandard construction works and poor quality of materials used in the project Mailu Road under PMGSY of PWD, Maibang division. This matter was also raised in the review meeting with the Hon’ble Union MoS, Women &amp; Child Development. This was a matter of great concern and embarrassment to the Council authorities as it tarnishes the image of the NCHAC as well as the district. The EE, PWD, Maibang was asked to take up the matter seriously and submit Action Taken Report at the earliest.</p>
6	COUNCIL PWD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Executive Engineer &amp; Estate Officer, Council PWD informed that under Special Package Fund of NCHAC for the Year 2023-24 an amount of Rs. 125.00 Crore was released by the Govt. against which a total of 197 Schemes were taken up and that all works are progressing satisfactorily. An average of 80% (approx) physical progress have been achieved so far.</li> <li>• Under RGSA the Govt. had released an amount of Rs.2.80 Crore for construction of VDC/CLDC Bhawan in each of the 28 MAC constituencies and Administrative Approval for its construction has been received.</li> <li>• It was also decided that under PMAAGY Schemes would be taken up to fill up infrastructure gaps in the district like construction of AWCs etc. The department to initiate the formalities at the earliest.</li> </ul>
7	CENTRAL SCHEMES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Under NLCPR (PWD &amp; Irri) there are 12 nos. of schemes out of which 6 have been completed and 2 are ongoing and 4 nos. are proposed to be foreclosed.</li> <li>• Under DHATC Package there are a total of 12 nos. of schemes out of which 5 have been completed and 7 are ongoing and that all works are progressing satisfactorily.</li> <li>• Under AIBP (Irri) there are 38 nos. of schemes and all have been completed.</li> <li>• Under PMKKKY there are 3 nos. of schemes and all works have been completed.</li> </ul>
